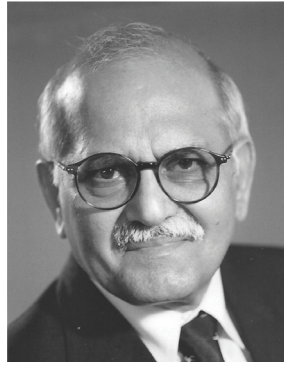

## Chairman's Message

Throughout last year, the Covid crisis raged with great fury, with the result that most of our activities received a setback. However, the last few months have provided some relief and hopefully things are looking up.

The year 2021 has special significance for us, as on 23 June we completed 10 years of our existence. To commemorate the occasion, we had an Anniversary meeting on Zoom. Maharaja Gaj Singh (affectionately known as Bapji) was the key speaker; he was joined by Shri Natwar Singh, Shri N.K. Singh and Dame Fiona Reynolds, Chairman of the International National Trusts Organisation (INTO). A presentation was made on our achievements, particularly in the fields of conservation of architectural heritage, promotion of crafts and music traditions, and rural development. We also highlighted areas where we are facing problems or feel we should be able to make more headway. A Vision Document for the next decade was also presented with emphasis on consolidation, and extending our activities to new areas.

A personal tragedy for ITRHD was the untimely loss of Anil Bhandari, a tourism stalwart, a close friend of many of us, and an active and invaluable advisor to ITRHD. He and his lovely wife Pamela were with us from the beginning. Pamela served as our Member Secretary in the crucial formative years, and now is an integral member of our Finance Committee, where her experience as an Income Tax Chief Commissioner is a great benefit. Anil is greatly missed, and we are very grateful to Pamela for carrying on so courageously.

We also were greatly saddened to lose two other valued friends, our Advisory Council Member S.P. Dutt and Life Member J. Veera Raghavan. Their support and encouragement were greatly appreciated, and we miss them.

## Sources of Funding

A major factor responsible for the slowdown of some of our activities has been lack of adequate financial resources. So far, our main sources have been the following:

- 1. Interest from Corpus** created from membership fees from different categories of membership particularly Corporate Membership (one-time Rs.10 lacs) and life Membership (one-time Rs. 5000) The initial vigor which resulted in 8 Corporate members and over 350 life members could not be sustained and our endeavour in the coming months is to launch a vigorous membership drive.
- 2. Projects.** A policy decision had been taken that a certain percentage, varying from 8-10%, of the project costs could be utilized for meeting expenses of administrative costs. This was especially helpful with major projects, such as those related to conservation of architectural heritage in Jharkhand and Haryana, and the organisation of cultural festivals in Patiala in Punjab.

In **Jharkhand**, for instance, we took on a major project relating to conservation of a historic jail in Ranchi, which was completed at a cost of Rs.9 crores (although some funds are yet to be released by the State Government), and the restoration of 63 terracotta temples in Maluti village (an ongoing project at a total cost Rs. 7.75 crores.). In **Haryana**, conservation of a 700 year-old historic Dargah was completed. In **Punjab**, the cost of cultural festivals was approximately 60 lakhs, but we fear that this source is likely to dry up with the change of Government in the State.

It will be seen from the above that with the completion of some projects and new projects not coming in we will be deprived of a valuable source of income.

- 3. The Ministry of Culture** sanctioned a Corpus Grant in 2017 of Rs. 5 crores. The interest from the Grant can be utilized only for projects, but not for meeting recurring expenditure including administrative costs. Here also we have suffered a loss of income with the interest rates going down.
- 4. CSR Funding.** In the past few years some of our activities such as the Azamgarh Festivals and Rakhigarhi Solid Waste Disposal received CSR support. Currently **Hindustan Gum and Chemicals Ltd.**, in Bhiwani have committed to providing Rs.1 crore for crafts development, architectural heritage conservation and skill development projects in Bhiwani and Barmer. We have also received support from **Petronet LNG Ltd.** (Rs.15 lacs for the primary school we set up in the musicians 'village of Hariharpur, Azamgarh'); from the **H.T. Parekh Foundation of HDFC** (Rs. 10 lacs) and from the **Give India Foundation** (Rs.5 lakhs) both for documentation of folk music.

Since Covid has taken a toll on many corporate budgets, we have had no fresh CSR support and the outlook for the next many months does not look too bright.

**We are thus facing a severe financial crisis** in meeting the expenditure on salaries of staff and other administrative costs, as the sources of income which could be utilized for such expenditure have dried up. The only saving grace is that for our ongoing and some new projects funds are still available from the interest of the 5 crore grant. And generous donations from some of our Trustees and friends have enabled us to build a small corpus and meet the ongoing operational expenses of the Hariharpur school.

To meet the present crisis efforts are being made to secure new projects, CSR sponsorship, and income from new members. A request has also been made to the Ministry of Culture to permit us to utilize a certain percentage of the income from the Government grant to take care of our running administrative costs for the next two or three years. In the meantime, however, we have had no option but to break some of our FD's.

A committee has been set up under the Chairmanship of Vice Chairman, Yogendra Narain to formulate recommendations for a strategic plan with a view to augment financial resources.

## **Potential New Sources of Funding**

The XVth Finance Commission headed by Shri N.K. Singh had recommended to the Government the implementation by ITRHD of 3 major conservation projects in Punjab and Haryana at a total cost of Rs.38 crores. Should this materialize, it would give us big relief, but all of this is in the realm of "If and When." We can just keep our fingers crossed.

We have applied for a new grant from the Ministry of Culture under a special programme- Financial assistance to Cultural Organisations with National presence for the financial year 2021-22, for the following activities:

- Documentation and conservation of rural heritage;
- Exposure of tourists to rural culture (rural tourism);
- Special publications;
- Crafts development and special festivals;
- Conserving music traditions;
- Youth activities;
- Promotional activities, such as conferences, seminars, lectures, etc.

By the time sanction is received (if we are fortunate enough to be selected), the time left for implementation may be just a few months and we would have to request for carry over to the next financial year. It may also require, depending on any amount sanctioned, a recasting of our budget.

## Hopeful Signs

In the midst of gloom, we have had some rays of sunshine. These have been:

### ***MOU with UP Tourism:***

An MOU was signed with UP Tourism in July 2021 under which funding would be available for certain activities carried out by ITRHD in partnership with them. These activities relate to:

- Documentation of heritage sites in the rural areas of the districts of Varanasi and Ballia
- Preparation of concept papers for the implementation of heritage tourism sites for Azamgarh and Shivpur in the district of Basti
- Development of Agri-tourism in villages identified by the Tourism Department
- Development of the Panchkosi parikrama near Ayodhya-the 14 Kosi parikrama and the 84 Kosi parikrama
- Preparation of a Five Year Plan for Documentation and preservation of heritage sites in rural areas of UP

This partnership will enable us to utilize a certain percentage of the costs of various projects for administrative expenses.

### ***Hariharpur Primary School Project:***

In 2013 a primary school was set up in the musicians' village of Hariharpur in district Azamgarh of UP to provide quality free education to children (with focus on the girl child) from economically backward communities. Initially housed in a rented building, we were able to construct two large rooms divided by wooden partitions into 4 from funds available from British Council. With classes expanding there was need for additional accommodation and facilities, but non availability of funds was a major constraint.

For day to day running of the school, as a result of annual donations received from our members and friends, we have been able to carry on. However, the existing building is in need of very urgent attention. There has been minimal maintenance primarily for want of funds. We have now been able to raise funds for maintenance of the existing building, boundary wall and provision of a modern kitchen and multi-purpose hall to also serve as a dining hall. This includes £ GB 10,000 (approx. Rs.10.08 lakhs) from Lady Nina Bracewell-Smith and Rs 5 lakhs from Shri Sushil Kumar. We expect to raise around 50 lakhs in all, with which construction activity will be resumed.

In order to put the school on a sound footing for the future it was decided to set up a corpus so that in future expenditure from the interest would keep it going. The ball was set rolling by our Trustee K.L. Thapar providing an initial grant of Rs.6 lakhs from the Asian Transport Institute and Trustee S.S.H. Rehman allowing us to divert



Rs.4 lakhs from his donation for a proposed tourist guest house in village Rakhigarhi (as Govt has already taken care of this need.). In addition, generous donations of one lakh or more from some of our members (Ramesh Chandra Rs.2 lakhs, Charles Lutyens, Lutyens Trust-UK, Nayana Goradia and Pushpa and Naveen Kapur one lakh each) has enabled the School Corpus to reach 15 lakhs. To ensure proper supervision a local Management Committee has been set up and a local person from Azamgarh appointed as Honorary Adviser.

We must also acknowledge the dedication of our faculty, all young educated women from the village, who have undergone intensive training and give their full commitment to their students and their new profession.

### ***Tree Plantation***

As part of our efforts to meet the challenges posed by global warming, a very successful massive tree plantation drive, with the active participation of the local communities, was launched in specific villages of Barmer (Rajasthan) and Azamgarh (UP), and in village Maluti in Jharkhand. Interest from the Government grant provided the necessary funding. The communities reacted with great enthusiasm, and we received extensive publicity.

### ***Rural Tourism***

It was decided that ITRHD should take the initiative in promoting rural tourism in areas where it has a presence. Accordingly, a task force for each region was set up and preliminary action planned for Barmer in Rajasthan, 3 villages with crafts and music traditions in Azamgarh district of UP, Shivpur village in UP (which is close to Ayodha and thus can be linked to religious tourism), and a circuit that would start from village Maluti in Jharkhand and link with adjoining villages in Bengal. In UP we have a partnership with the Department of Tourism. Promotion of rural tourism will also lead to rural development in general which is one of our main objectives. The very distinguished Pandurang Taware, acknowledged as the father of Agri-tourism in India recently joined as Honorary Advisor, which will be of immense help in this area.

### ***Music Workshops***

A recent and very successful activity was launched in village Barnawa in the Barmer region of Rajasthan. The week-long workshop had three master musicians from the village working intensively with ten young musicians. The intent was to keep the rich *langa* music tradition of the village alive by ensuring that the next generation continues it. The credit for this initiative goes to Sangya Chaudhary, Director, Rural Development & Youth Affairs, assisted by Arvind Yadav, Assistant Project Manager. Several recordings from the workshop have been uploaded on to our website and a Power point on the entire project will also soon be available on our website. Another workshop is planned for village Hariharpur in Azamgarh district.

### ***Partnership with Birla Institute of Technology, Mesra, Ranchi***

An MOU was signed with the Institute in October 2021 under which we will take on the following projects:

- ITRHD in partnership with the Institute will identify areas on which to work in the field of heritage tourism and development of rural sector;
- ITRHD will facilitate the Faculty and students of the Institute to visit heritage sites and also involve them in training programmes;
- ITRHD Jointly with BITM will prepare project and feasibility reports for developing infrastructure for rural tourism;
- ITRHD will jointly organise capacity building programmes especially in the rural sector with funding from Government and other funding agencies.

### ***Increasing HART involvement***

ITRHD had entrusted field responsibilities in different regions to persons specially designated as HARTS (Heritage Ambassadors for Rural Tradition). Unfortunately, except for some extremely effective and dedicated exceptions – notably Shreedeo Singh for Jharkhand, Yashovardhan Shandilya for Barmer, and very recently Zohra Chatterji for UP – none of the others have created an impact. To be fair to them, there has been very little interaction from our side as well. To ensure better coordination and interaction Shaguna Gahilote has taken on the responsibility in an honorary capacity to interact with them on a regular basis to get better results. Shaguna is a very experienced person having interacted with Chapter heads in INTACH and later working with British Council and UNESCO.

### ***Azamgarh Festivals***

With a view to providing support to music and craft traditions in dire need of help, ITRHD initiated what was known as the Azamgarh Festival in 2013. Suitable venues first in Delhi and later in Lucknow also were provided to the weavers of Mubarakpur and the potters of Nizamabad to display and sell their products directly to customers without the intervention of middlemen. Similar facilities were provided to the classical musicians of Hariharpur to perform before sophisticated audiences.

ITRHD has been meeting the entire expenditure (provided by sponsors) including transport costs, board and lodging and payment of honorarium to musicians. The artisans benefitted immensely and made substantial profits, all of which accrued to them. ITRHD did not retain any of the proceeds. As this facility has been on for about 7 years, we felt that there was now a need for change in policy, as spoon feeding could not continue indefinitely. Accordingly, it has been decided that for craftspersons from Nizamabad and Mubarakpur, ITRHD would only arrange for suitable venues free of cost and take care of publicity. All other expenditure would henceforth be the responsibility of craftspersons themselves. This rule would however not apply to musicians, who do not earn anything from their performances as they are open to the public free of cost.

ITRHD will, however continue to bear all expenses of craftspersons from other regions needing support till such time as is considered necessary.

## **The ITRHD Team**

During these very difficult times, we have been able to survive and even accomplish some new things only because of the support and untiring efforts of our Trustees, honorary officers, members, sponsors, friends, and staff. I cannot mention all of them here, but must single out a few for special mention.

Our Trustees are bulwarks of strength. Bapji, Maharaja Gaj Singh of Jodhpur, has been with us from the beginning, and this year was especially involved in advising on our Barmer activities. His presence as Chief Guest, and thoughtful address, made our 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary meeting on zoom a special event.

Yogendra Narain (former Secretary Defence and Secretary General Rajya Sabha) is our very active Vice Chairman and also Chairman of the Finance Committee. He has also been a great help in raising financial resources, and I depend on him greatly. Our two Vice-Chairpersons also have actively contributed to our success. Prof. AGK Menon, supervises all our conservation projects, and has headed some crucial internal committees. Maureen Liebl, my anchor in life, plays a crucial role in many activities, and her professional experience in India and with international funding agencies is a great benefit, especially in project proposals and development.

Mr. K.L. Thapar, Founder Chairman of the Asian Institute of Transport Institute and formerly with the Planning Commission, has provided truly extraordinary support, both in terms of project development and financial generosity. We owe him a tremendous debt of gratitude.

Dr. D.V. Kapur is another extremely distinguished Trustee, as the Founder Chairman of the NTPC and Secretary in the Ministries of Power, Heavy Industry, and Chemicals & Petrochemicals. He has been with us in every meeting, ready with fresh ideas and solid advice based on his vast experience.

In the cultural field, Anita Singh, has led in developing our music programs in Azamgarh and elsewhere, and in organizing our Patiala festivals. Laila Tyabji, one of India's leading crafts specialists, is always helpful in providing advice and guidance.

Amrita Singh, as Trustee and Co-Director of the Barmer Crafts Project, has shown extraordinary initiative in not only developing new initiatives, but in arranging for funding and implementation. Due to her efforts, our tree plantation and relief efforts in Barmer, as well as activities involving the crafts initiative, have been successful beyond all expectations.

SSH Rehman, Trustee and legendary hotelier, has helped generously in funding and in providing advice and hospitality. Naresh Arora continues to give us good guidance in all legal matters. P.R. "Kaku" Khanna, an eminent Chartered Accountant, and Ashwan Kapur, an extremely successful and creative businessman, have not only lent their weight to the Finance Committee but have been assets on the Board as well. Harsh Lodha, head of the Birla Corporation, readily agreed to come on our Board and gave us the start that we badly needed by getting three of his companies to become Corporate members at Rs.10 lacs each. In addition, one of his Bhiwani based companies has enabled us to embark on 3 projects by providing financial support under their CSR programme.

Apart from the Trustees, Archana Kapoor, formerly C&MD of the Tourism Finance Corporation of India, serves as honorary Member Secretary of the Trust. She has shouldered a great responsibility, taking care of the finances of the Trust, overseeing administration, and ably organising various events.

One of our younger officers, Sangya Chaudhary, works with us in an honorary capacity as Director, taking on, among other things, the editorship of our publications and youth activities. In September 2021, she organized an extremely successful music workshop in the village of Barnawa (Barmer District, Rajasthan), where senior musicians mentored the juniors. It received wide publicity and was highly appreciated.

We have recently been very fortunate in gaining the addition of the very distinguished S.D. Kapoor (former Chairman, MMTC, among many other accomplishments), as Member of the Finance Committee. Rajendra Sharma who had been with the Tourism Corporation of India for nearly 20 years, continues to work with us in an honorary capacity, providing objective and sound advice.

The eminent architect Shibam Ganju, continues his close engagement with the school in Hariharpur, and along with his associate Prateek, is involved in detailed planning for the school expansion. Preeti Harit, a young architect, has handled our conservation and documentation projects in Haryana and Kerala with great professionalism, and is undertaking new projects in UP. Another experienced conservation architect, Shaista Perveen, has taken an active role in advising on Azamgarh projects. As she is from Azamgarh, she is uniquely qualified to bring a realistic perspective to her analyses.

We recently have also been fortunate to be joined by Shaguna Gahilote, an education and cultural specialist with many years' experience with INTACH, UNESCO, the British Council, the Embassy of Belgium, and others. In an honorary capacity she has taken on responsibility for interaction with our HARTS (Heritage Ambassadors for Rural Tradition).

The HARTS are our eyes and ears in the field. As mentioned earlier, we have two extremely dedicated and active HARTS, Shreedeo Singh, based in Ranchi, who has been responsible for our major Jharkhand projects, and Yashovardhan Shandilya, consultant to the Barmer Crafts Initiative, who also serves as HART for the Barmer region, and

with indefatigable energy, and complete dedication has been responsible for much of our success in Barmer. They have been joined by Zohra Chatterji, formerly Secretary in the Government of India, who is now based in Lucknow and has already initiated a major new rural tourism project.

Our Advisory Council Members, those both in India and abroad, contribute valuable guidance and support. I should especially mention Rashmi Malik, Principal of the Salwan Public Schools, is actively involved in developing our educational programs. Mondira Bhardwaj, a friend and colleague of long-standing, has devoted extraordinary assistance by training the teachers of the Hariharpur Primary School, including hosting them in her own home during Delhi training sessions.

Several other very experienced professionals have also joined us as advisors. I might mention especially Rajni Sibal Sekri, former senior bureaucrat, and Swapna Liddle, historian and heritage education specialist. Both are published authors and have already taken an active role. Priya Poddar recently joined us as social media coordinator, and thanks to her, our presence on Instagram, LinkedIn, Twitter and Facebook is rapidly growing. As we are becoming more involved in rural tourism projects, the agreement of Shri Pandurang Taware, widely acknowledged as the father of Agri Tourism in India, is a tremendous boost.

Some of our international members and friends have given great support. Dame Fiona Reynolds, Chair of INTO (International National Trusts Organisation) graced the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary zoom with the opening address. Geoffrey Read, a long-time friend and supporter, has taken on the responsibility for planning our venture into climate control activities. Geert Robberechts, head of our Belgian chapter, has joined us in a formal partnership for the Royal Gardens of Rajnagar project. Charles Lutyens, Naveen and Pushpa Kapur, old friends and colleagues in the US, sent a generous contribution for the Hariharpur school. And Lady Nina Bracewell-Smith in the UK has recently become a major donor and supporter.

Our small administrative staff have worked with dedication throughout the lockdown. Our Finance Director, Arun Gupta, recently retired, and was replaced by an experienced person, Raju Lheel. Neeraj Ganotra, now our longest-serving team member, oversees technical matters and is involved in many project activities. Madhu Khatri capably oversees human resources and coordinates projects. Ambika Surendran serves as Private Secretary, oversees many admin tasks, and deals with our Trustees, officers, members, and all others with tact and courtesy. She is a calm and always cheerful presence. Arvind Yadav works with great professionalism, assisting in the office and the field in projects in Barmer, Azamgarh, Patiala, and the Azamgarh Festivals. Ramu Kumar has been learning the ropes in finance, and Akash Thapa is a faithful presence in the office, providing assistance to all whenever needed. Deepak Kumar Gond works as our Field Supervisor at Azamgarh.

Finally much of our success we owe to the financial support we have received for our

projects from the State Governments of Jharkhand, UP, Punjab, Haryana and Telangana, from the Ministry of Culture, Government of India, who awarded us a grant of Rs.5 crores for our corpus, from the Archaeological Survey of India who gave a grant of Rs.10 lacs for a conservation project in Haryana, to the Haryana Waqf Board for support to the same project, and to the Ministry of Sports for supporting our publication on Rural Sports. In addition, the corporate sector and PSU's have responded to our appeal to sponsor special events. The generous CSR support we have received from Hindustan Gum & Chemicals Ltd., has enabled us to develop projects in Bhiwani (Haryana) and Barmer (Rajasthan). Our thanks also go out to the number of companies who very kindly agreed to support our publications through their advertising support. It would not have been possible for our publications to be so well received if it had not been for the excellent articles contributed by experts in different fields on non-payment basis. As mentioned above, Trustees K.L. Thapar and Habeeb Rehman have generously supported us, and a number of our members responded with great generosity to our Hariharpur school appeal.

To all, our heartfelt thanks.

## **Conclusion**

In planning for the future, we are faced with huge challenges; primarily the lack of adequate financial resources. In addition to project funding, we need to secure greater resources for administration. There is a need to inject a greater degree of professionalism in our staff. We are working with just a handful of persons on a salary and they have done a good job keeping the ship afloat. Most of the professional responsibility in finance, fund-raising, and project development and implementation, however, is shouldered by our trustees and senior officers, all working on an honorary basis. Addition of experienced professionals to the staff will ensure greater continuity and enlargement of our scope. It may be mentioned that we have been emphasizing to our staff that, being an NGO, we should not strictly be bound by government procedures. A result-oriented rather than a bureaucratic approach should be the guiding principle.

We are hoping for the best, and the Vision Document will be our guide for the future with modifications where considered necessary.

# INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

## To the Members of Indian Trust for Rural Heritage and Development

### Report on the Audit of Financial Statements

#### *Opinion*

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **Indian Trust for Rural Heritage and Development** (the trust), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2021, the Statement of Income & Expenditure and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the financial statements, read with other notes given thereto, give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- i) in the case of the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Trust as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021; and
- ii) in the case of the Income and Expenditure Account, of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

#### *Basis for Opinion*

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by ICAI. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Trust in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of financial statements, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### **Responsibilities of management and those charged with governance for the financial statements**

Management of Trust is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position and financial performance of the Trust in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting standards issued by ICAI, to the extent applicable. In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Trust's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Trust or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Trust's Management is responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process.

## **Auditors' responsibility for the audit of the financial statements**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatement can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Trust to cease to continue as a going concern.



- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

## **Other matters**

We report that:

- a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- b) In our opinion proper books of account have been kept so far as appears from our examination of those books; and
- c) The Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts;
